TEACHER DIRECTIONS - FORM A

Teacher says: Look at Sample A. There are three words in the box. They are careless, careful, and carefully. These words look alike but end differently. I will say one word. Then I will use that word in a sentence. Then you need to find that word and fill in the circle under it. Mark the circle under the word careless. He dropped the ball because he was careless. Careless.

Wait while students select an answer choice.

Teacher says: Which circle should you have filled in? That is correct. You should have filled in the first circle. It is the one under the word careless.

Teacher says: Look down at number 1. Find the word looking. We are looking for some new clothes. Looking.

Look down at number 2. Find the word liveliest. We picked the liveliest kitten in the bunch. Liveliest.

Look down at number 3. Find the word chased. The cat chased the bird. Chased.

Look down at number 4. Find the word rockier. This path is rockier than the first one we went on. Rockier.

Teacher says: Look at Sample B. There are three words in the box. They are walrus, rainbow, and elephant. One of these words is made up of two little words. Is it walrus, rainbow, or elephant? Mark the circle under the word you think is made up of two small words.

Wait while students select an answer choice.

Teacher says: Which circle should you have filled in? That is correct. You should have filled in the circle under the second word. It is the one under the word rainbow. Rainbow is made up of two little words. Now you will do numbers 5 through 8 by yourself. Stop when you come to the word STOP. Put your pencil down and sit quietly when you are done.

Wait while students work numbers 5 through 8.
